Rules for Livestock and Poultry

All entries will be received subject to the following conditions:

- 1 The names and registered numbers of sire and dam together with date of birth and name of breeder (if known) must accompany all entries in Pedigree Classes. Entries must be made on the prescribed forms, accompanied by the appropriate Entrance Fees, otherwise the entry will not be accepted, and the exhibit will not be allowed to compete. All Entry Forms must be signed by the Exhibitor or the Exhibitor's Agent.
- 2 **Entry Fees will not be refunded where entries are withdrawn after the close of entries, except where the Society cancels classes.**
- 3 All Exhibits must be bonafide property of the Exhibitor at the time of entry and for at least two months prior to the Show. Any Exhibitor found guilty of infringing this Rule will forfeit all Prize Money and may be debarred from showing for a period of not more than five years.
- 4 Any prize may, at the discretion of the judges, be withheld or modified, according to merit.
- 5 The Show will open at 9 a.m. o'clock. No stock for exhibition will be admitted after that hour and no animals may leave the Show before 4 p.m. without the written permission of the Secretary.
- 6 No member of Board or Steward being an Exhibitor, will under any circumstances, be allowed to enter the ring where his/her exhibit is being judged.
- 7 The ages of Cattle and Horses to be computed by teeth as define in the rules of the Royal Ulster Agricultural Society.
- 8 An Exhibitor making any objection must lodge £10 with the Secretary, which, in the event of the objection not being sustained, will be forfeited to the Society. No objection will be received later than 1 hour after the completion of the relevant Class, with the exception of an objection re valuation of any Exhibitor, in which case objection will be held to be in order if lodged within three days after Show Day. Should any matter arise not provided for in the purview of these Rules and Regulations, such matter shall be referred to the Committee of which 3 Members shall form a quorum, whose decision shall be final and binding, no appeal to law in any case being permitted
- 9 Reasonable care will be taken of all exhibits. But the directors will not be accountable for any loss, damage. or injury that may occur to any exhibit. before, during or after, the Show
- 10 Any act of disobedience to the orders of the Stewards or Officials of the Show by any Exhibitor or his servants will render liable to forfeiture any prizes awarded to said Exhibitor, and the offender will immediately be dismissed from the Show Grounds.
11. The Board reserves to itself the right to alter the programme in any way it

- deems necessary, and Exhibitor must be prepared to abide by any regulations laid down.
12. A farmer for purposes of entering a restricted class shall be defined as one whose main source of living is derived from farming.
 13. Exhibitors are cautioned to attend promptly to have their exhibits placed in the Judging Ring so as to facilitate the Judges in their work. No exhibit will be allowed into the Judging Ring after the Judges have commenced their work of adjudication. This applies to all Classes in the, Cattle, Sheep and Swine and Poultry Sections. All Classes will be judged in the Catalogue order.
 14. "Overstocking" or "hafting" of milk cows will entail immediate disqualification. The Judge of the Class is empowered to disqualify or have milked in the Ring any exhibit.
 15. Tampering with Exhibits. - No artificial device whatever may be adopted for the purpose of interfering with the udders of cattle. No Cows or Heifers presented in the Judging Ring may have sealed teats. Any Exhibitor found infringing this Regulation will be disqualified from exhibiting at the Show.
 16. In group competitions for Cups or Special Prizes no animal may be exhibited unless previously entered in a class for which it is eligible.
 17. The word "heifer" in all Classes is held to be an animal which has never had or has never slipped a calf.

A 5% levy will be deducted from prize money in the livestock classes and forwarded to the Irish Shows Association.

EXHIBITORS SHOULD ENSURE THAT CURRENT DARD REGULATIONS IN RELATION TO DISEASE CONTROL AND CATTLE MOVEMENT TO SHOWS ARE COMPLIED WITH.

Show guidance for Exhibitors moving animals into and out of Local Agricultural Shows as supplied by DARD

I. Important Note for Cattle Exhibitors 2011

Procedure for Movement of Northern Ireland (NI) Cattle Into and Out of Local Agricultural Shows

Disease Control

NB - only animals free from disease restrictions, including Tuberculosis, Brucellosis and Bluetongue (herd or individual animal restrictions), may be permitted to move to a Show. To minimise the risk to other livestock, exhibitors are encouraged to have Show animals tested for Tuberculosis by their Private Veterinary Practitioner in the 30 days beforehand. All bovine animals that are more than 12 months of age (with the exception of bullocks) must have a 'clear' Brucellosis test for a sample taken within the 30 days prior to movement to a show. Exhibitors should bring proof of this negative Brucellosis test result to the Show.

Cattle, pre-movement tested in a herd, can move to a Show but must return directly to the same herd in which they were tested. These cattle can then move to another Show provided the move occurs within 30 days of the original date of sampling and the 6 day whole farm standstill requirements have been fulfilled.

Identification

All cattle must be properly identified and comply with the Cattle Identification Regulations.

General Principles

- Cattle going to a Show(s) must be accompanied by a fully completed MC2 document identifying the Show premises as the destination.
- Cattle moving from a Show must return to their presenting herd.
- On return to the farm the cattle must not move again, except to slaughter, for a period of 6 days (6 day whole farm standstill).
- An exemption from this whole farm standstill will be permitted when animals returning from a Show are held in an approved isolation facility for a period of 6 days. Animals in an approved isolation facility may not move to a Show - see Annex A.

The number of Shows to which cattle may travel is not limited provided these conditions are met on all occasions.

Movements To or From a Show

Movements To a Show

On arrival at the Show, the cattle must be accompanied by a fully completed MC2 document and proof of a negative result to the Brucellosis Pre-Movement Test.

The top 3 copies (MC2A-White, MC2B-Yellow and MC2C-Pink) must be brought to the Show. All 3 copies will be checked by a Show Representative and stamped with the Show stamp.

The MC2A (white) will be retained by the Show Operative.

Movements From a Show (including Show Operator's Responsibilities)

1. Where the exhibitor has their Sticker Book with them the Show will issue an MC2 endorsed with the herd number of the exhibitor and the serial number of the 'move in' MC2. The MC2A (White) and MC2B (Yellow) 'move out' copies should be stapled to the Yellow 'move in' copy and have a yellow confirmation sticker applied. This should then be sent to the local DARD office by the Show Operatives. The MC2C (Pink) 'move out' copy should be stapled to the Pink 'move in' copy and have the corresponding pink sticker applied. This should be given to the herd keeper for his/her own records (see Annex B).

2. Where the exhibitor does not have their sticker book with them the Show will issue a 'move out' MC2 with ALL details completed (including animal details). The MC2A (White) copy should be sent to the local DARD office and the MC2B (Yellow) and MC2C (Pink) copies should be given to the exhibitor. The MC2B, with a yellow sticker attached, must be returned to the herd keeper's local DARD office within 7 days (to avoid an NMN status) and the MC2C, with corresponding pink sticker attached, should be kept for his/her records (see Annex C).

Procedure for Movement of Cattle From the Republic of Ireland (RoI) Into and Out of Shows

NB - In order to receive cattle from the RoI, the Show premises must be operating to full EU Assembly Centre Standards for cattle and be approved for this purpose (as part of these requirements RoI cattle must be kept segregated from NI cattle.)

Cattle imported Directly To a Show

NB - animals must be registered on APHIS before they can move into a Show.

Cattle entering a Show will be accompanied with a Passport and a Health Certificate.

The Show Operative will enter the animal(s) details onto the MC2 then send the completed MC2A (White) MC2B (Yellow) and MC2C (Pink) documents to the local DARD office.

MC2D (Blue) should be retained in MC2 book.

The Show will be issued with its own self written notification book.

Cattle Re-Exported Directly From a Show.

Cattle re-exporting to RoI will need to be accompanied by:

- MC2L (produced by the local DVO);
- Passport (produced by the local DVO);
- Their original Health Certification suitably endorsed by the Veterinarian responsible for the Show;
- Non Co-Minglement Certificate which will be issued by the Veterinarian responsible for the Show.

2. Important Note for Sheep Exhibitors 2011

Procedure for Movement of Northern Ireland Sheep Into and Out of Shows

Identification - For Moves To and From a Show

Livestock entries close MONDAY 11th JULY 2011

All sheep, irrespective of their date of birth, must be identified with two identifiers bearing the same number, including one with an EID device.

Movement of Sheep to and from a Show - See Annex D

- Movement of sheep to Shows must be accompanied by a fully and accurately completed SG2 self-written movement document.
- The individual identification numbers should be recorded on the SG2 document (it is acceptable to attach a printed schedule listing the tag numbers to the SG2). These numbers should be checked by the Show Operators against the animals presented before the animals are allowed entry to the show.
- The SG2 movement document authorises the movement of sheep or goats from the farm to Show premises. The SG2 movement documents must be stamped by the Show Secretary. The white copy should be sent to the local DARD Direct/ Divisional Veterinary Office within 7 days.
- Show Operators should have one book of movement documents (SG2s) for sheep and a separate one for goats.
- The yellow copy of the SG2 provided by the Show Operator should accompany the animals back from the Show. This should include details of the Show and receiving flock, the individual tag numbers (manually added or scanned list) or be cross referenced/ stapled to the pink copy of the incoming SG2 (only if the whole batch moves out at the same time). Section 3 of the outgoing SG2 should be signed by the flock keeper.
- Both move in and move out white copies of the SG2 should be sent to the Show's local DARD Direct/Divisional Veterinary Office by the Show Operator within 7 days.
- On return to the farm the sheep should not move again, except to slaughter, for a period of 6 days (6 day whole farm standstill).
- An exemption from this whole farm standstill will be permitted when animals returning from a Show are held in an isolation facility for a period of 6 days. Animals in an approved isolation facility may not move to a Show - see Annex A.

Procedure for Movement of Sheep From the RoI Into and Out of Shows

Sheep must have two matching identifiers, one of which must carry an EID device.

NB - In order to receive sheep from the RoI, the Show premises must be operating to full EU Assembly Centre Standards for sheep and be approved for this purpose.

As part of these requirements, RoI sheep must be kept segregated from NI sheep.

Sheep Imported Directly into a Show

Sheep entering a Show will be accompanied with a Health Certificate which should be copied to the local DARD Office responsible for the show. An SG2 document should be completed for the move from the RoI to the show (Show's own SG2 book).

Sheep Re-Exported Directly From a Show

Sheep re-exporting to the RoI will need to be accompanied by:

- Their original Health Certification suitably endorsed by the Veterinarian responsible for the Show.
- Non Co-Minglement Certificate which will be issued by the Veterinarian responsible for the Show.

- An SG2 document which should be completed for the move from the Show to the ROI (Show's own SG2 book).

3. Important Note for Goat Exhibitors 2011

Procedure for Movement of Northern Ireland Goats Into and Out of Shows

Identification - For Moves To and From a Show

All goats, irrespective of their date of birth, must be identified with two identifiers bearing the same number.

Movement - Goats Going to a Show - See Annex D

- Movement of goats to Shows must be accompanied by a fully and accurately completed SG2 self-written movement document.
- The individual identification numbers should be recorded on the SG2 document (it is acceptable to attach a printed schedule listing the tag numbers to the SG2). These numbers should be checked by the Show Operators against the animals presented before the animals are allowed entry to the Show.
- The SG2 movement document authorises the movement of sheep or goats from the farm to Show premises. The SG2 movement documents must be stamped by the Show Secretary. The white copy should be sent to the local DARD Direct/Divisional Veterinary Office within 7 days.
- Show Operators should have one book of movement documents (SG2s) for goats and a separate one for sheep.
- The yellow copy of the SG2 provided by the Show Operator should accompany the animals back from the Show. This should include details of the Show and receiving herd, the individual tag numbers (manually added or scanned list) or be cross referenced/stapled to the pink copy of the incoming SG2 (only if the whole batch moves out at the same time). Section 3 of the outgoing SG2 should be signed by the herd keeper.
- Both move in and move out white copies of the SG2 should be sent to the Show's local DARD Direct/Divisional Veterinary Office by the Show Operator within 7 days.
- On return to the farm the goats should not move again, except to slaughter, for a period of 6 days (6 day whole farm standstill).
- An exemption from this whole farm standstill will be permitted when animals returning from a Show are held in an isolation facility for a period of 6 days. Animals in an approved isolation facility may not move to a Show - see Annex A.

Procedure for Movement of Goats From the ROI Into and Out of Shows

Goats must have two matching identifiers.

NB - In order to receive goats from the ROI, the Show premises must be operating to full EU Assembly Centre Standards for goats and be approved for this purpose.

As part of these requirements, ROI goats must be kept segregated from NI goats.

Goats Imported Directly into a Show

Goats entering a Show will be accompanied with a Health Certificate which should be copied to the local DARD Office responsible for the show. An SG2 document should be completed for the move from the ROI to the show (Show's own SG2 book).

Goats Re-Exported Directly From a Show

Goats re-exporting to the RoI will need to be accompanied by:

- Their original Health Certification suitably endorsed by the Veterinarian responsible for the Show.
- Non Co-Minglement Certificate which will be issued by the Veterinarian responsible for the Show.
- An SG2 document which should be completed for the move from the Show to the ROI (Show's own SG2 book).

4. Important Note for Pig Exhibitors 2011

Procedure for Movement of Pigs Into and Out of Shows

Disease status and testing requirement

- Only pigs from OADF status holdings are permitted to attend shows.
- In addition, all pigs entered for the Show must be accompanied by an Aujeszky's Test Certificate of Negative Result relating to a test completed on or after 01/04/2011. Pigs will not be allowed to gain entrance to the Show unless the necessary veterinary certificates are submitted to Show organisers.
- Protocol has not been agreed between DARD and ROI authorities so pigs from the ROI should not be allowed entry to the Show as this may downgrade all NI pigs in Show.

Movement control.

- Pigs moving to a show must be accompanied by an OADF Declaration of Movement. Exhibitors are reminded that they should submit the original "green" movement document to the show organiser and forward the "white" copy of the declaration to their local DARD office as soon as possible. This one document serves to move the batch of pigs into and out of the show.
- On return to the farm the pigs should not move again except to slaughter for a period of 6 days. An exemption from this whole farm standstill will be permitted when animals returning from a Show are held in a DARD Approved Isolation Facility for a period of 6 days. Animals in an approved isolation facility may not move to a Show - see Annex A.

Identification requirements

- Each pig should be clearly marked by means of ear tag or tattoo with a holding number and, in the case of a breeding pig, with an individual animal number as well.

Show organiser responsibilities

Show organisers are reminded that they are obliged to:

- a. ensure that all pigs entered into a Show are accompanied by the above correct documentation, and
- b. collect the OADF Declaration of Movement (green in colour) for each batch of pigs moved in and submit them to DARD as soon as possible.

5. Important Note for Poultry Exhibitors 2011

The Show organisers must comply with the conditions of a general licence which is on the DARD Internet at <http://www.dardni.gov.uk/index/animal-health/animal-disease-control-and-prevention/avian-influenza/avian-influenza-questions-and-answers/bird-gatherings-and-markets.htm>

It is recommended that all entries in the poultry section are vaccinated against Newcastle disease.

7. Bio-security

Gathering animals together from many farms in different areas of the country has the potential to spread animal disease. It is the responsibility of every exhibitor to reduce this risk to a minimum and thus to protect his/her own livestock and that of other farmers. No animal under DARD restriction, or showing signs or symptoms of any disease, must be brought to a Show.

Vehicles used to transport any animals to the Show must be cleansed and disinfected before leaving your farm, with special attention being paid to the underside and wheel arches. Any equipment brought to the Show should also be cleansed and disinfected.

Clean protective clothing and footwear should be worn when handling animals.

If bedding is to be used at the Show, it should be fresh and clean. Contaminated bedding should not be removed from the transport vehicle at the show grounds.

Contact between animals while at the Show should be kept to a minimum.

Prior to leaving the show grounds, or immediately on return home, protective clothing and footwear should be thoroughly cleansed and disinfected. Vehicles used to transport animals should be thoroughly cleansed and disinfected with special attention being paid to the underside and wheel arches.

Any signs or symptoms of disease occurring in animals that have been at the Show, during the following two to three weeks, must be reported to the Show organisers. In the case of notifiable diseases, your local DARD office should also be notified.

DARD particularly encourages every exhibitor of in-calf cattle to assess carefully the risk of spreading brucellosis before deciding to present such cattle for showing. Exhibitors should ask themselves:

- Has there been any known brucellosis infection in my area recently?
- Have the in-calf cattle I intend exhibiting been bought in recently and do I know their movement and health history?
- Have I had any abortions in my herd, have I reported them and have they been tested and cleared?
- Is my herd undergoing a testing regime because of disease risk?
- Is my herd's brucellosis testing up-to-date?

If you are in any doubt, contact the staff of the local DARD office who will be happy to discuss the matter and offer advice.

8. Animal Transport Rules

Farmers are reminded to comply with the animal transport rules which came into operation in 2007 and apply in all EU member states.

The rules apply only to all those who transport animals for economic purposes, but there are no exclusions from the general obligation to transport all animals in ways which do not cause unnecessary suffering.

Anyone transporting animals for economic purposes over a distance exceeding 65 km (40 miles) must be authorised by their competent authority – DARD in the north of Ireland.

Additional conditions, including prior vehicle approval, apply to those who undertake long journeys (over 8 hours).

However, if you are a farmer and move your own animals in your own vehicle for distances of less than 65km (40 miles), you do not need to be authorised by DARD.

Also, it is important to note that all drivers and attendants transporting farmed livestock, horses or poultry over 65 km (40 miles) will need to have a certificate of competence. 9. Key Points

- Contact between animals at Shows poses risks to animal health.
- Exhibitors have a responsibility to protect the health of their own animals as well as those belonging to other exhibitors.
- Pregnant animals pose additional risks with respect to the spread of Brucellosis.
- Farmers should assess the risks before taking animals to Shows; if in any doubt they should check with their local DARD Office that there are no herd or individual restrictions that would prevent a move to the Show.
- High standards of hygiene must be maintained with regard to vehicles, equipment, protective clothing and contact between animals.
- Exhibitors should be especially vigilant in monitoring the health of animals for some time after they return from Shows.
- Cattle and sheep from the RoI may only attend show premises in NI that are operating as EU Approved Assembly Centres for the relevant species on that day.
- Further advice may be sought from the local DARD Direct/Divisional Veterinary Office.
- Exhibitors and Show Organisers should be aware of the risk of zoonotic disease - these are diseases that people can get through contact with animals. This may also occur when the animal appears healthy. Whilst under normal circumstances this should not be a problem, the stress of movement and mixing or, of non-apparent illness may lead to increased secretion of infective agents such as E.coli O157, TB, BR, Salmonella species and Leptospira species. Show Organisers should ensure that a Risk Assessment is carried out for each show and that appropriate precautions are taken at all times especially where children, or immuno-compromised adults may come into contact with animals, their products and excreta.

Summary of Show Operators Responsibilities

Show Operators must comply with:

- The Identification and Movement of animal procedures in line with The Sheep and Goats (Records, Identification and Movement) Order (Northern Ireland) 2009, Cattle Identification (Notification of Births, Deaths and Movements) Regulations (NI) 1999 and Aujeszky's disease Order (Northern Ireland)1994 – this includes checking the individual identification of every animal

- Effective disease control measures
- Animal Health legislation

Summary of Exhibitors Responsibilities

Show Exhibitors must comply with:

Annex A

6 Day Whole Farm Standstill

1.Movement of cattle, sheep, goats or pigs onto a farm will trigger a 6 day whole farm standstill for all species.

2.Exemption from this whole farm standstill will be permitted in these cases:

- Movement of animals directly to a slaughterhouse even if the farm is under standstill.
- Movement to a Veterinary Treatment Centre or laboratory for diagnostic testing provided the animals at the Treatment Centre are isolated.
- Movements to and from an Artificial Insemination Centre, provided a protocol is in place that ensures that animals from different sources are held separately at the Artificial Insemination Centre.
- Movement from any location when individual animals entering premises are held in a DARD approved Isolation Facility for a period of 6 days before mixing with other livestock or onward movement to another premises, that is, a 6 day standstill will apply only to the animals held in isolation. In this case the animals held in isolation must not move out of the isolation facility for at least 6 consecutive calendar days. Only the animals in isolation will be required to remain under standstill on the farm (in isolation) for 6 days and the standstill will not

affect other animals on the farm, that is, other animals may move off the farm. Animals in a DARD approved isolation Facility should not move to a Show.

- Movement by a dealer of animals bought in by him /her onto his/her Trading Premises and then moved onto other premises within 6 days, providing the animals are moved to or from the dealer's trading premises in accordance with the conditions of a specific licence granted by DARD. The animal can move only once from the dealer's trading premises directly to a farm where the standstill arrangements then apply, or to a slaughterhouse in Northern Ireland. The animal must not move from the dealer's trading premises to a market or another dealer's trading premises.

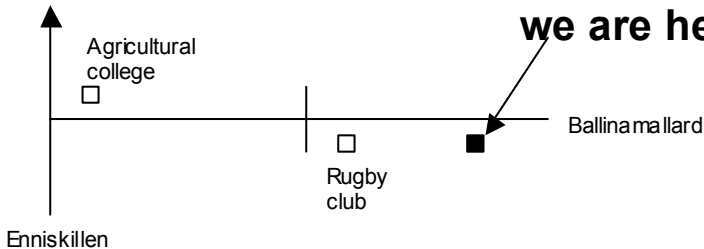
