# Rules of the Society

All entries will be received subject to the following conditions:

1. **The names and registered numbers of sire and dam together with date of birth and name of breeder (if known) must accompany all entries in Pedigree Classes.** Entries must be made on the prescribed forms, accompanied by the proper Entrance Fees, otherwise the entry will not be accepted, and the exhibit will not be allowed to compete. All Entry Forms must be signed by the Exhibitor or the Exhibitor's Agent.
2. All Exhibits must be bonafide property of the Exhibitor at the time of entry. and for at least two months prior to the Show. Any Exhibitor found guilty of infringing this Rule will forfeit all Prize Money and may be debarred from showing for a period of not more than five years.
3. Any prize may, at the discretion of the judges, be withheld or modified, according to merit.
4. The Show will open at 9 a.m. o'clock. No stock for exhibition will be admitted after that hour and no animals must leave the Show before 4 p.m. No other exhibits before 4 p.m. unless by written permission of the Secretary.
5. No member of Committee or Steward being an Exhibitor will under any circumstances, be allowed to enter the ring where his exhibit is being judged.
6. The ages of Cattle and Horses to be computed by teeth as defined in the rules of the Royal Ulster Society.
7. All prize horses must be certified free from hereditary disease by the Society's V.S. except in the jumping and driving competition.
8. An Exhibitor making any objection must lodge £10 with the Secretary, which, in the event of the objection not being sustained, will be forfeited to the Society. No objection will be received later than 1 hour after the completion of the relevant Class, with the exception of an objection re valuation of any Exhibitor, in which case objection will be held to be in order if lodged within three days after Show Day. Should any matter arise not provided for in the purview of these Rules and Regulations, such matter shall be referred to the Committee. of which 3 Members shall form a quorum, whose decision shall be final and binding, no appeal to law in any case being permitted
9. Reasonable care will be taken of all exhibits. But the Committee will not be accountable for any loss, damage. or injury that may occur to any exhibit. before, after, or during the Show
10. Any act of disobedience to the orders of the Stewards or Officials of the Show be any Exhibitor or his servants will render liable to forfeiture any prizes awarded to said Exhibitor, and the offender will immediately be dismissed from the Show Grounds.
11. The Committee reserves to itself the right to alter the programme in any way it

deems necessary, and Exhibitor must be prepared to abide by any regulations laid down.

12. A farmer for purposes of entering a restricted class shall be defined as one whose main source of living is derived from farming.
13. Exhibitors are cautioned to attend promptly to have their exhibits placed in the Judging Ring so as to facilitate the Judges in their work. No exhibit will be allowed into the Judging Ring after the Judges have commenced their work of adjudication. This applies to all Classes in the Horse, Cattle, Sheep and Swine Sections. All Classes will be judged in the Catalogue order.
14. "Overstocking" or "hafting" of milk cows will entail immediate disqualification. The Judge of the Class is empowered to disqualify or have milked in the Ring any exhibit.
15. Tampering with Exhibits. - No artificial device whatever may be adopted for the purpose of interfering with the udders of cattle. No Cows or Heifers presented in the Judging Ring may have sealed teats. Any Exhibitor found infringing this Regulation will be disqualified from exhibiting at the Show.
16. In group competitions for Cups or Special Prizes no animal may be exhibited unless previously entered in a class for which it is eligible.
17. The word "heifer" in all Classes is held to be an animal which has never had or has never slipped a calf.
18. **A 5% levy will be deducted from prizemoney in the livestock classes and forwarded to the Irish Shows Association.**

## **CATTLE MOVEMENT REGULATIONS TO SHOWS AS SUPPLIED BY DARD**

### **1. Important Note for Cattle Exhibitors 2008**

Procedure for movement of Northern Ireland (NI) cattle into and out of Local Agricultural Shows

#### **Disease Control**

Only animals free from tuberculosis and brucellosis restrictions (herd or individual animal restrictions) may be permitted to move to a Show. To minimise the risk to other livestock, exhibitors are encouraged to have Show animals tested for TB by their veterinary practitioner in the 30 days beforehand. All bovine animals which are more than 12 months of age (with the exception of bullocks) must have a clear brucellosis test for a sample taken within the 30 days prior to movement to a show. Exhibitors should bring proof of this negative brucellosis test result with them to the Show. Cattle, pre-movement tested in a herd, can move to a Show but must return directly to the same herd in which they were tested. These cattle can then move to another Show provided the move occurs within 30 days of the original date of sampling and the 6 day standstill requirements have been fulfilled.

#### **Identification**

All cattle must be properly identified and comply with the cattle identification regulations.

#### **Movement**

Cattle going to a Show(s) must be accompanied by a fully completed MC2 document identifying the Show premises as the destination.

Cattle moving from a Show must return to their presenting herd. Cattle must be accompanied by a fully completed MC2 document completed by the Show Operative, showing the presenting herd as the destination. (Please note: the Show will be allocated with a self-written MC2 Movement Book.)

On return to the farm the cattle should not move again except to slaughter for a period of 6 days (6 day whole farm standstill).

An exemption from this whole farm standstill will be permitted when animals returning from a Show are held in an isolation facility for a period of 6 days. Animals in an approved isolation facility may not move to a Show. See Annex A.

The number of Shows to which cattle may travel is not limited, provided these conditions are satisfied on all occasions.

#### **Movements to a Show**

## Entries close 14th July 2008

On arrival at the Show, the cattle must be accompanied by a fully completed MC2 document and proof of a negative result to the Brucellosis Pre-Movement Test. The top three copies (MC2A-White, MC2B-Yellow and MC2C-Pink) must be brought to the Show. All three copies will be checked by a Show representative then stamped with the Show stamp. The MC2A (White) and MC2B (Yellow) should be retained by DARD staff and the MC2C (Pink) retained by the Show operative.

### **Movements from a Show**

On return from a Show the cattle will be accompanied by a MC2B (Yellow) and MC2C (Pink) document fully completed by the Show operative. A yellow confirmation sticker should be applied to the MC2B and the corresponding pink confirmation sticker applied to the MC2C. The MC2B must be returned to the herd keeper's local DVO within 7 days (to avoid an NMN status) and the MC2C should be kept for his/her records.

Procedure for movement of cattle from the Republic of Ireland (RoI) into and out of Shows

Please note: In order to receive cattle from the RoI, the Show premises must be operating to full EU Assembly Centre Standards and be approved for this purpose. (As part of these requirements RoI cattle must be kept segregated from NI cattle.)

### **Cattle imported directly to a Show**

Animals must be registered on APHIS before they can move into a Show.

Cattle entering a Show will be accompanied with a Passport and Health Certificate.

The Show operative will enter the animal(s) details onto the MC2 then give the completed MC2A (White) MC2B (Yellow) and MC2C (Pink) documents to DARD staff. MC2D (Blue) should be retained in MC2 book. The Show will be issued with its own self written notification book.

### **Cattle re-exported directly from a Show.**

Cattle re-exporting to RoI will need to be accompanied by the following documents:

" MC2L and Passport;

Their original Health Certification suitably endorsed by the Veterinarian responsible for the Show;

Non cominglement certificate which will be issued by the Veterinarian responsible for the Show.

## **2. Important Note for Sheep and Goat Exhibitors 2008**

## Entries close 14th July 2008

Procedure for movement of Northern Ireland sheep and goats into and out of Shows

### **Identification**

Sheep and goats travelling to Shows may be identified by means of an approved eartag/eartags, an electronic means of identification or a tattoo.

### **Movement**

Sheep and goats going to a Show(s):

Movement of sheep and goats to Shows must be accompanied by a MS2 self-written movement document.

The MS2 movement document authorises the movement of sheep from and to the farm via the show premises. The MS2 movement documents must be completed and stamped by the Show Secretary. A yellow copy accompanies the sheep or goats back to the farm of origin. The Show representative should endorse the completed white MS2 documents, and return them to the local Divisional Veterinary Office within seven days. The exhibitor keeps the yellow copy for his/her own records and the Show keeps the pink copy.

On return to the farm the sheep and goats should not move again except to slaughter for a period of 6 days. (6 day whole farm standstill.)

An exemption from this whole farm standstill will be permitted when animals returning from a Show are held in an isolation facility for a period of 6 days. Animals in an approved isolation facility may not move to a Show. See Annex A attached.

Procedure for movement of sheep and goats from the RoI into and out of Shows

Please note: In order to receive sheep and goats from the RoI, the Show premises must be operating to full EU Assembly Centre Standards and be approved for this purpose. (As part of these requirements RoI sheep and goats must be kept segregated from NI sheep and goats.)

### **Sheep and goats imported directly into a Show**

Sheep and Goats entering a Show will be accompanied with a Health Certificate.

### **Sheep and goats re-exported directly from a Show**

Sheep and goats re-exporting to the RoI will need to be accompanied by the following documents:

Their original Health Certification suitably endorsed by the Veterinarian responsible for the Show.

Non cominglement certificate which will be issued by the Veterinarian responsible

for the Show.

### **3. Important Note for Pig and Poultry Exhibitors 2008**

#### **Procedure for movement of pigs and poultry into and out of Shows**

##### **Pigs**

Pigs entered for the Show must be accompanied by an Aujeszky's certificate of negative result. Pigs will not be allowed to gain entrance to the Show unless the necessary Veterinary Certificates are submitted to Show organisers. Pigs from the RoI should not be allowed entry to the Show, as this will downgrade all NI pigs in Show.

The following documents will also be required, and conditions met:

1. OADF declaration of movement.
2. Each pig should be clearly marked with the holding number of the holding on which it is kept and, in the case of a breeding pig, with an individual animal number as well.
3. On return to the farm the pigs should not move again except to slaughter for a period of 6 days.
4. An exemption from this whole farm standstill will be permitted when animals returning from a Show are held in an isolation facility for a period of 6 days. Animals in an approved isolation facility may not move to a Show. See Annex A attached.
5. Completed final entry form with ear number particulars of all pigs entered and the class in which entered. (All ear numbers will be checked by stewards to ensure that pigs present have been correctly identified. This list will be forwarded to BPA to check eligibility, that is, birth notified and the correct age for the class.)

##### **Poultry**

The organisers of the Show must comply with the conditions of a general licence which is on the DARD Internet.

It is recommended that all entries in the poultry section are vaccinated against Newcastle disease.

##### **5. Biosecurity**

## Entries close 14th July 2008

Gathering animals together from many farms in different areas of the country has the potential to spread animal disease. It is the responsibility of every exhibitor to reduce this risk to a minimum and thus to protect his/her own livestock and that of other farmers. No animal under DARD restriction, or showing signs or symptoms of any disease, must be brought to a Show.

DARD particularly encourages every exhibitor of in-calf cattle to assess carefully the risk of spreading brucellosis before deciding to present such cattle for showing. Exhibitors should ask themselves:

Has there been any known brucellosis infection in my area recently?

Have the in-calf cattle I intend exhibiting been bought in recently and do I know their movement and health history?

Have I had any abortions in my herd, have I reported them and have they been tested and cleared?

Is my herd undergoing a testing regime because of disease risk?

Is my herd's brucellosis testing up-to-date?

If any doubt exists, staff at DVOs will be happy to discuss the matter and offer advice.

Vehicles used to transport any animals to the Show must be cleansed and disinfected before leaving your farm, with special attention being paid to the underside and wheel arches. Any equipment brought to the Show should also be cleansed and disinfected. Clean protective clothing and footwear should be worn when handling animals. If bedding is to be used at the Show, it should be fresh and clean. Contaminated bedding should not be removed from the transport vehicle at the showgrounds. Contact between animals while at the Show should be kept to a minimum.

Prior to leaving the showgrounds, or immediately on return home, protective clothing and footwear should be thoroughly cleansed and disinfected. Vehicles used to transport animals should be thoroughly cleansed and disinfected with special attention being paid to the underside and wheel arches. Any signs or symptoms of disease occurring in animals that have been at the Show, during the following two to three weeks, must be reported to the Show organisers. In the case of notifiable diseases, your DVO should also be notified.

### **6. Animal Transport Rules**

Farmers are reminded that new animal transport rules, which apply in all EU member states, came into operation in 2008. The rules apply only to all those who transport animals for economic purposes, but there are no exclusions from the general obligation to transport all animals in ways which do not cause unnecessary

suffering.

Anyone transporting animals for economic purposes over a distance exceeding 65 km must be authorised by DARD. Additional conditions, including prior vehicle approval, apply to those who undertake long journeys (over 8 hours).

However, if you are a farmer and move your own animals in your own vehicle for distances of less than 65km, you do not need to be authorised by DARD.

Also, it is important to note that all drivers and attendants transporting farmed livestock, horses or poultry over 65 km will need to have a certificate of competence. ### **7. Key Points**

Contact between animals at Shows poses risks to animal health.

Exhibitors have a responsibility to protect the health of their own animals as well as those belonging to other exhibitors.

Pregnant animals pose additional risks with respect to the spread of brucellosis.

Farmers should assess the risks before taking animals to Shows.

High standards of hygiene must be maintained with regard to vehicles, equipment, protective clothing and contact between animals.

Exhibitors should be especially vigilant in monitoring the health of animals for some time after they return from Shows.

Cattle and sheep from the RoI may only attend show premises in NI that are operating as EU Approved Assembly Centres on that day.

Further advice may be sought from the local Divisional Veterinary Office.

Annex A

### **6 Day Whole Farm Standstill**

1. Movement of cattle, sheep, goats or pigs onto a farm will trigger a 6 day whole farm standstill for all of these species.

2. Exemption from this whole farm standstill will be permitted in the following cases:

Movement of animals directly to a slaughterhouse even if the farm is under standstill.

Movement to a Veterinary Treatment Centre or laboratory for diagnostic testing provided the animals at the treatment centre are isolated.

Movements to and from an Artificial Insemination Centre, provided a protocol is in place that ensures that animals from different sources are held separately at the AI centre.

Movement from any location when individual animals entering premises are held in a DARD approved isolation facility for a period of 6 days before mixing with other livestock or onward movement to another premises, that is, a 6 day standstill will apply only to the animals held in isolation. In this case the animals held in isolation must not move out of the isolation facility for at least 6 consecutive calendar days. Only the animals in isolation will be required to remain under standstill on the farm (in isolation) for 6 days and the standstill will not affect other animals on the farm, that is, other animals may move off the farm. Animals in an approved isolation facility should not move to a Show

Movement by a dealer, of animals bought in by the dealer onto his/her trading premises and then moved onto other premises within 6 days, providing the animals are moved to or from the dealer's trading premises in accordance with the conditions of a specific licence granted by DARD. The animal can move only once from the dealer's trading premises directly to a farm where the standstill arrangements then apply, or to a slaughterhouse in Northern Ireland. The animal must not move from the dealer's trading premises to a market or another dealer's trading premises.

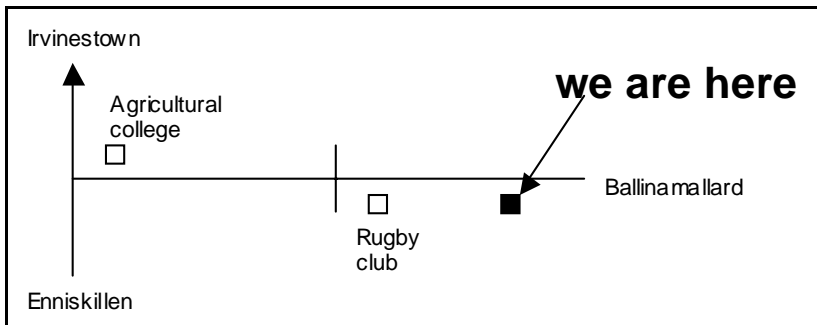
